Package I: Increase Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) along phase-in/flat portions, Child and Dependent Care Tax Credit (CDCTC) fully refundable and targeted to young children, increase access to WorkAdvance program for low-income men with children, raise minimum wage to $\$ 10.25$
Package 2: Increase EITC along phase-in/flat portions, CDCTC fully refundable and targeted to young children, $\$ 2000 / \mathrm{yr}$ child allowance per child

Package 3: Increase EITC along phase-in/flat portions, CDCTC fully refundable and targeted to young children, increase Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits, increase housing vouchers to serve 70\% of eligible families
Package 4: Increase EITC by 40\% overall, CDCTC fully refundable and targeted to young children, $\$ 2700 / \mathrm{yr}$ child allowance per child, raise minimum wage to $\$ 10.25$, restore immigrant eligibility for means-tested programs
